Sons In Retirement is a nonprofit public benefit corporation for retired men, devoted to the promotion of independence and dignity of retirement.

SIR's purpose is to assist men in renewing former friendships and provide opportunities to make new friends through association with other retirees.

The only requirement for membership is that a man be retired and sponsored by an active member.

Membership shall be open to men retired from fulltime gainful occupation, regardless of age, race, color or religion.

Declarations

Important: When a member is unable to attend a meeting, he should notify the Attendance Chairman A.S.A.P.

Attendance Rule: Regular members missing (3) consecutive meetings without notifying the Attendance Chairman, giving a valid reason, or attending less than six (6) consecutive meetings within the past twelve (12) months, shall be notified of pending termination. Certification of attendance at another Branch Meeting is considered a credit.

Prospective Members: Must attend a Luncheon and be introduced by a sponsor to the general membership prior to being accepted as a new member of the Branch.

Non-Responsibility Clause: All travel activities arranged for or by Sons In Retirement, Inc. and its Branches are for the convenience and pleasure of the members and their guests who desire to participate. Sons In Retirement, Inc. and its Branches do not assume responsibility for the well being or safety of the participants or passengers, or their property, in any matters pertaining to said travel and other activities.

Checks For Travel Activities: Checks for travel activities of three (3) nights or less shall be made payable to the Branch, or if arranged through a travel agency, checks may be made to the travel agency, at the Branch's option. Checks for events of four (4) or more nights shall be payable to the travel agency involved.
